Am I Qualified?

- 🔔 **Must have a valid driver's license**
- 🔔 **Must be of good physical condition to perform the work required**
- 🔔 **Must have a sincere interest in the trade**

What can I expect while training?

- 🔔 **Program requires 6,000 hours on the job**
- 🔔 **You must pass an aptitude test**
- 🔔 **Some travel may be required**
- 🔔 **Must attend an orientation**
- 🔔 **On-the-job Training with an experienced Journeyman**
